#### New Natural Playground Opens at Klehm Arboretum & Botanic Garden

On August 18, FPWC joined Klehm Arboretum & Botanic Garden in celebrating the opening of the much-anticipated natural playground located in the Nancy Olson Children's Garden.



This new natural playground features a variety of unique wooden structures that are designed to encourage children of all

ages and abilities to interact with their environment through natural elements and landscapes. The playscape will be open year-round.



The development of the natural playground was made possible by a \$389,900 grant administered by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources through the Open Space Land Acquisition and Development (OSLAD) program.

Since 2017, he held the position of Director of Operations and Planning for the Champaign Park District in Champaign, Illinois. His responsibilities included 54 parks and trail systems, a natural areas and arbor crew, 15 facilities including two historic buildings, 33 playgrounds, splashpads and more.

Prior to the Park District, he worked for the Champaign County Forest Preserve District, most recently as the Executive Director and the Director of Natural Resources prior to that. During his time there, he helped acquire several parcels of land that were restored to prairie, savanna and forest. He also oversaw the Lake of the Woods Golf Course and campgrounds, an environmental education staff and the Museum of the Grand Prairie. Dan graduated

from Eastern Illinois University with a Bachelor's degree in Zoology.

"I believe parks, natural areas and recreational opportunities are a vital need of every community, not just an amenity," Dan says. "I am very excited to join the dedicated and talented team at the Forest Preserves. I have been following their initiatives and accomplishments over the past dozen years or more, and I am inspired to carry the mission forward for the community and visitors. The benefits and opportunities that natural areas offer have been an integral part of my life. I look forward to bringing those experiences to others."



Other capital improvements included repaving the cart path and the roadway nearby the clubhouse to ensure a smooth ride for golfers.






